


## Koroit and District Primary School 14th February 2025

#### **Principal Report**

I couldn't be prouder of how the children have settled into KDPS this year. It is hard to identify the foundation children as they move around the school with such confidence. Our grade 6 children are enjoying the time to be leaders of the school and are certainly stepping up to showcase what KDPS has to offer.

#### **School Council and Parents, Carers and Friends**

#### What is School Council

The School Council is the committee of management for the school. It includes the Principal, other staff, parent, community and possibly student representatives. It has extensive powers over the management of the school, as set out in the <u>Policy and Advisory Library</u>.

The School Council has some big responsibilities; the school budget, Strategic Plan, school governance and employment issues.

#### Parents, Carers and Friends (PCF)

A Parent Club is set up to represent the interests of parents at the school, to support parents and to carry out activities for and on behalf of parents. Parent Clubs can be more of an open forum for parents and focus on activities that meet parents' needs – social events, guest speakers, volunteer activities to benefit the school and fundraising. They can also be a think-tank or sounding board for the school (e.g. the school might want to seek school community opinion on the introduction of a new school uniform item).

Our Parents, Carers and Friends have worked incredibly hard to ensure that the funds raised for our school are put back into the student and student learning.

Last year our PCF supported the opportunity to purchase new readers for the F-2 area, assisted in the supply of new iPads for the grade 5/6 children, purchased new picnic mats and outdoor furniture for the whole school and a new marquee for all sporting events. They also assisted with grants to support STEAM with the purchase of coding robots and free books.

It is not possible to run a small school without the support of our parent body. Our PCF group are incredibly inclusive and welcome all parents, whether it be to attend meetings or popping your hand up to support fund raising events.

#### **Garden Tidy Up**

#### **Naplan**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. The NAPLAN assessment period is from Wednesday 12th of March until the 18th March.

We have enjoyed the variety of weather from 34 degrees to a heavy shower of rain which is a great educational experience to ride in different conditions. Most days have also been quite windy. The kids have shown great skills navigating the different roads and crossings. It's been

amazing to see the bike racks fill up at school with over 35 bikes today. Not only is bike riding to school great for the health benefits. It's a huge advantage for the children's confidence and resilience. Aswell as having less congestion around the school carparks of a morning and afternoon.

We had some amazing things happen while out on our travels. We had one amazing student stop to pick up the bins in front of the library which was very community minded. We look forward to continuing the program after camp due to the large uptake. Anyone yet to join will have an opportunity. Students with low confidence on a bike are most welcome to join and we can alter the program to keep in the school grounds for some basics on the oval or running track.




















#### **Grade 6 leadership positions**






2 - The roofing is due to be fitted out with lights over the next few weeks.




