

Principal Report

Day one for 2025 (Teacher's return)

On Tuesday, the staff at KDPS worked together to affirm our commitment to our KDPS values. Throughout the years, KDPS has implemented numerous initiatives that have contributed to teaching and learning; however, discussions with staff and students revealed a lack of a cohesive understanding of KDPS values. Consequently, we have come together to concentrate on the values and culture we aim to instil at KDPS, with an emphasis on maintaining these standards through 2025.

School values play a crucial role in establishing standards and reinforcing the behaviour policy within an educational setting. By imparting and consistently exemplifying KDPS values, schools contribute to the character development of their students while fostering their overall growth. School values, provide students with a moral framework that influences their decisions and actions throughout their lives.

Mrs Vesey has worked with the students in 2024 to hear student voices on what values they wanted to see, hear and feel in 2025, this along with staff conversation has allowed us to begin this conversation with a solid database.

The values that we have landed on include; we belong, we are proud, we are respectful, and we are safe.

The next steps are to ensure that we restructure our Behaviour Matrix. This will be shared with parents when it is completed.

Reading Expectations

In 2025 KDPS staff are encouraging all children to read at home regularly. All children from grades F-4 will be required to have a reader satchel which is expected to come to and from school each day. In the coming days, your child/ren will be provided with texts to read at home and a sign in sheet.

Our aim is to immerse students in quality literature and book experiences so that we can nurture a love of reading in our students and encourage life long readers. We do this by engaging our students in best Literacy teaching and learning practices and experiences.

Reading at home can also include:

- Being read to.
- Reading and recording on the Ipad
- · Shared reading
- Telling a story using the picture cues
- Reading together.

BIKE ED

Next week Dave Holscher will run a Bike Education program for our regular bike riders on Wednesday and Friday. This essentially will be about riding safely to and from school, school expectations, riding on the footpath and the like. The Bike Ed program is a program that gives children the opportunity to learn about safe riding behaviours, road rules and riding in a shared environment.

To do this, children who ride bikes will need have their parents complete the *Local Permissions* form on Xuno. Children will be excluded if this is not done.

Today, the great 6 children received notification of the process for leadership positions. School Captains will present their school Captain speeches on Friday the 7th of Feb to the grade 3-6 children. We hope to announce school captains on Monday 10th of February.

The Build

Many of you may have noticed that we have made some progress with the building between the junior children and the grade 3/4 children. The roof has been completed and the decking started. We are hoping that the decking will be completed in the coming days. This is not expected to upset classroom practice. The window at the far end of the deck will be completed in the middle of February.

Big Life at KDPS

You might have heard your child/ren saying, "We had Big Life today!" But what does that mean?

Big Life is all about helping prepare young people to cope with the ups and downs of life. Melanie from Big Life is onsite at Koroit & District Primary School every second Friday this term, teaching a lesson to each of the F-2 classes (grades 3-6 in semester 2). Feel free to chat to Melanie when she is onsite.

This term, Big Life lessons will help students:

- Identify the expected & unexpected behaviours in different places,
- Name & recognise emotions and the different Zones of Regulation,
- Learn & practice coping strategies for when they are feeling worried, angry, sad, or overexcited.
- Identify their strengths and the positive qualities in others.

In addition to their work onsite, the Big Life team supports staff by providing teaching resources and professional learning throughout the year. Families can also access learning opportunities through Big Life to help support you and your child/ren at home – stay tuned for the free Big Life Parent Forum

School Saving Bonus

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB helps families cover the cost of uniforms, textbooks, excursions, activities and more.

Most families have now received their SSB code(s). I encourage you to take advantage of this government support.

To learn more about the SSB online system, download the step-by-step System guide for parents and carers (DOCX, 945KB) or watch this School Saving Bonus video. System guide translations are also available in 14 languages.

If you would like to use your bonus for school activities, you can allocate some or all of the bonus using the School Saving Bonus online system.

If you have only recently completed your enrolment into the Victorian government school system you can expect to receive your SSB code(s) in the coming weeks.

If you have transferred to our school from another Victorian government school, any remaining funds on your SSB code(s) will soon be available to use at our approved school suppliers. We request your patience as this change is processed.

State School Relief

Who is eligible?

State Schools' Relief provides support to any Victorian student attending a government school (primary, secondary or specialist), on the advice of the school.

Schools are able to submit an application directly, via our online portal, whenever they believe there is a need to support a student whose family/carers are facing difficulty in providing the appropriate uniform, footwear or educational items for attending school.

- Situations include, but are not limited to:
- Unemployment
- Health issues/illness
- Financial difficulties
- Independent living and/or homelessness
- Natural disasters, house fires
- Bereavement
- Domestic violence

All applications are processed within 24 - 48 hours and you will receive confirmation of application/s by email. Orders will then be delivered within 4 working days.

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS

FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

1. \$150 for primary school students

\$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments: your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances,** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

KDPS Waste and Litter Journey- 2025!


