


# Koroit and District Primary School 7th February 2025

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. The NAPLAN assessment period is from Wednesday 12th of March until the 18th March.

#### What is a school council and what does it do?

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the broad direction of a school, in accordance with Ministerial Order 1280 Constitution of Government School Councils, and the *Education and Training Reform Act 2006*. In doing this, a school council may directly influence the quality of education for students.

#### Who is on the school council?

For most primary school councils, there are several possible categories of membership:

• A mandated elected parent member category –members of this category generally comprise more than one third of the council's total membership. Department employees can be parent members at their child's school providing that they are not engaged in work at the school.

• A mandated elected school employee member category – members of this category make up no more than one-third of membership. The principal of the school is automatically one of these members.

• An optional community member category – members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experience. Department employees are not eligible to be community members.

• A small number of school councils have nominee members.

For all schools with a Year 7 and above cohort, there is an additional category of membership:

#### • A mandated elected student member category, two positions.

Generally, the term of office for all members is two years. The term of office of half the members expires each year, creating vacancies for the annual school council elections.

#### Why is parent membership so important?

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills and a range of experiences and knowledge that can help inform and shape the direction of the school.

Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying and may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

#### Do I need special experience to be on school council?

Each member brings their own valuable skills and knowledge to the role, however, in order to successfully perform their duties, councillors may need to gain some new skills and knowledge.

It is important to have an interest in your child's school and the desire to work in partnership with others to help shape the school's future.

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### Student Attendance

Regular attendance at school is **very important** for your child's learning and social development. Very good attendance for a child is 95% and above.

It is important that children are at school as much as possible to ensure the **BEST** opportunity for learning growth. We need to utilise every available minute to ensure student growth academically, socially and emotionally, in and out of the classroom.

If early collection for a shopping trip or to beat the traffic happens on a regular basis this can take away from valuable learning time throughout their schooling life. Please take the time to read the graphic below and to understand the long term affect this can have on student development. We understand that students are impacted by illness, injury or other ailments. If your child is going to be absent you are required by legislation to notify the school by:

- Logging onto Xuno or ringing the school
- Enter the absence for full days only
- If your child/children arrive late or are being collected early, the office staff will enter this onto Xuno for you.

### Grade 5/6 Camp

Our Year 5/6 camp to Melbourne will be from Monday February 17th to Wednesday February 19th. Please complete the online permission form to ensure your child can attend. The cost of the camp will be set at \$380 per student, which includes activities, accommodation, travel, and food (students will need a packed lunch from home on the first day).

We will be taking the train from the Warrnambool train station to Southern Cross station in Melbourne. From here it is a short walk up Collins Street to our accommodation.

The train **leaves Warrnambool at 6:12am** and it is parents/carers responsibility to ensure students are at the station on time. Further information including packing list, medical forms and Code of Conduct have been given to students and are to be completed and returned.

### Medication

ASTHMA MANAGEMENT PLANS- Each year our records are updated for those students who have asthma. If your child has asthma, you will soon receive a General Medical Advice Form and an Authority to Administer Medication at school. Students are required to have a current

Asthma Plan, of which we require a copy. We would appreciate it if these forms could be completed ASAP.

MEDICATION AT SCHOOL For those students who need to have medication stored or administered during school hours, we require a signed authority from the parent/guardian. Medications that are prescribed, are to be in a labelled blister packaging from the chemist. Any increase or change in dosage will require a new Medication Administration Form signed by the parent/guardian and a confirmation letter from the consulting doctor. Medication Administration Forms are available from the office. Medications must be handed to the classroom teacher or into the school office. Medications or creams are not to be kept in school bags.

### **Bike Education**

This week, we conducted our first Bike Education program, with Dave Holscher assisting small groups of children in practicing their riding skills both at school and within the community. This event provided an excellent opportunity for the children to showcase their abilities while learning important safety practices for cycling.





### Grade 6 leadership positions

Today, I had the privilege of viewing the Grade 6 Leadership speeches. The children presented themselves in a very professional manner and the audience showed respect and consideration of all applicants. It is a very exciting phase for the grade 6 children and they should be incredibly proud of how they represented KDPS.



### The Build

You may have noticed that our school staffing car park has opened back up. We thank the builders for their understanding and our parent community who have been impacted by the extra parks being utilised for staff car parks.

We are hoping for delivery of the decking next week to complete the deck restoration; electrical works will also begin next week. The window delivery will occur week beginning 24 Feb and then completion of the lining boards and installation of blind.

The area is looking fabulous and will only get better with the final stage of the build.


